PERMAX Class Action (Banerjee v Eli Lilly Canada Inc. et al)
Our File No. 094436

We write to you in regards to the drug Permax (generic name: pergolide mesylate) and the serious behavioural changes it may have caused your patient.

We are the lawyers representing all persons in Canada who were prescribed and ingested Permax at any time before February 8, 2010 (the "Class Members").

Our claim is for damages and other monetary relief against the Defendant drug companies for allegedly developing, manufacturing and selling (without adequate warning) Permax in Canada. Our claim alleges that Permax causes obsessive/compulsive behaviour, including pathological gambling and/or other obsessive/compulsive behaviours such as: hypersexuality, body picking, compulsive shopping and over-eating.

The Court has certified a class action and has approved a "Negotiation Process" aimed at facilitating the resolution of this case. If a Class Member wishes to participate in this Negotiation Process, he or she must fill out a Questionnaire and must also provide us with a note signed by his/her doctor confirming the existence of certain impulse control behaviour(s) experienced by the Class Member since being prescribed Permax.

You have been asked by your patient to sign the attached note on his/her behalf. Doing so may help your patient recover compensation for some of his/her losses. If you have any questions about the note or the "Negotiation Process", please do not hesitate to contact us.
